

Fall 2016 MUS 320 Applied Music for Music Majors

REQUIREMENTS

1. LESSONS

Music majors enroll for credit in MUS 320 each semester by audition. The Department of Music provides a half-subsidy for private lessons for declared music majors on their primary instrument. The nonrefundable \$400 applied music fee will be added to the bursar bill for students who are enrolled in MUS 320. The Department does not pay for secondary instrument instruction.

2. MUS 320 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to perform on a MUS 320 Student Recital once a year: juniors and seniors perform in the fall; freshmen and sophomores in the spring. Schedule will be available several weeks into the semester. A program is printed for each recital. Performances must be 7 minutes or less. Submit titles, composer and dates, and other information to the Academic Services Coordinator one week prior to the performance. Performance for the Concerto Competition will only count toward the MUS 320 performance requirement if the student makes the final round. Otherwise, they will be scheduled on a MUS 320 Student Recital after the preliminary round of the Concerto Competition.

3. MUS 320 CONCERT ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS EACH SEMESTER

MUS320 Student Recitals – Attend 2 Schedule below

Sign in and out at the recital with the Academic Services Coordinator. Students may not include the recital on which they perform as one of their attendances nor may junior or senior recitals be substituted for this requirement.

Additionally, students are required to attend and perform on any studio classes and master classes scheduled by the instructor.

4. GRADE

The student's grade will be based on preparation for the weekly lesson, attendance at all performances listed above, and the student's solo performance on Student Recital and Final Jury Exam. If a student does not attend BOTH required performances, the MUS 320 grade will be lowered by one full letter grade (A to B; A- to B-, etc.)

5. STUDENT RECITAL PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE, PERFORMING ARTS STUDIO,

2:30PM Thursdays: November 3, 10, 17; December 1

2:30PM Saturday, November 12*; Sunday, November 20 (*A 4:30 recital may be added to 11/12.)

6. JURY/FINAL EXAMS: December 7th

Students will perform a final exam jury performance at the end of the semester, scheduled by the department.

7. ACCOMPANIST

During the semester that the student performs on a MUS 320 Student Recital, the Music Department will provide an accompanist for the recital and jury performance at no additional charge if deadlines are met. (Juniors/Seniors in the fall; Freshmen/Sophomores in the spring.)

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students may be excused from a lesson only in the case of religious observance, extreme illness, or family

emergency, and with at least twenty-four hour notice to the instructor. One "make-up" lesson per semester may be scheduled at the instructor's discretion, and no refunds or partial refunds are given.

GUITAR REQUIRMENT

Guitar students enrolled in MUS 310 are required to have a standard classical (nylon string) guitar.

- a. Non-cutaway is preferred
- b. The scale length should be approximately 26 inches and the 12 fret should meet the body. If you plan to purchase a guitar please ask Dr. Enloe for advice.
