For the best experience students should following these guidelines for Zoom lessons:

Before you join the meeting, open the Zoom app on your device, go to Settings >> Meetings, and switch on "Use Original Sound".

Audio Settings:

For best results you should use headphones with a separate microphone for better audio quality and minimize external noise. I cannot offer my best teaching if I cannot hear your guitar. The microphone attached to headphones or ear buds will not pick up the guitar, so using separate microphone, such as the [Blue Snowball iCE USB Microphone](#) and headphones or ear buds is essential.

1. Set Audio to "Original Sound" to preserve the quality of music. Go to Settings > Audio > Advanced Settings > Show in-meeting option to "Enable Original Sound."
2. Disable "Suppress Persistent Background Noise" to prevent cutting off sustained musical tones.
3. Turn off "Automatically adjust microphone volume" to have more control over your audio levels.
4. Disable "Enable Echo Cancellation" to prevent interference with musical sounds. Go to Settings > Audio > Advanced Settings.

Be sure to have a quiet space for your lessons with flexibility to re position yourself, or your camera so I can see your playing posture and both your left and right hands.

If possible, use a wired internet connection for stability, familiarize yourself with participant controls, like muting and unmuting, to manage the lesson flow.

The above guidelines will allow you the best experience on Zoom. Remember to test these settings in advance to ensure a smooth and uninterrupted lesson experience.

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
